Local 222 Members Caught in Political Crosswinds Caused by Tariffs

ON FRIDAY, MAY 2ND, GENERAL MOTORS ANNOUNCED

the reduction of the 3rd shift in early November of this year. This decision will impact over 700 members at the GM unit and have an equally devastating impact on the supplier units. This decision by GM is nothing short of premature and reckless. This decision is nothing more than an olive branch extended to the 47th president of the United States of America. This decision has nothing to do with sales, nothing to do with future forecasts of product demand but merely moving 50,000 units per year from Oshawa to a plant in the States. Being caught in political crosswinds is nothing new to Local 222, but regardless, the impact is devastating.

The following Monday, May 5th, myself, along with Truck Plant Chair Chris Waugh and his District Committeepersons met with Premier Ford and his key cabinet ministers. Premier Ford shared our anger with GM and we began a discussion surrounding a path forward. This is not a time for politics, not a time for fear mongering or social media opinions, but rather a time the members have to unite and come together. The leadership of this union at the National level, the Local, and the Chair of the Truck plant continue to demand answers from the levels of government that can step forward and partner with the company to navigate these headwinds called tariffs.

The Local union is committed to send our service reps into plants, lunchrooms, homes, wherever is necessary to help and assist members with employment insurance needs. We have very capable service reps, I strongly encourage members to call the hall, or come to the hall and take advantage of their skills.

Durham Region Transit bargaining

At the time of writing this article, we are deep into negotiations with the Region to secure a respectable contract for our DRT unit members. It has been a pleasure to see how hard

the DRT committee is working and how united the DRT membership is as we move towards a deadline. Local 222 is

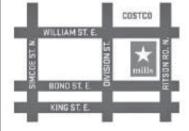

Union Prepared to Fight Forecasted Shift Loss at GM

I WOULD LIKE TO CONGRATULATE JASON GALE FOR BEING

hired as National Staff Representative for Unifor. Jason will be responsible for General Motors and many other units.

Jason started his role as Chairperson in Oshawa with a very small footprint in 2020. Shortly thereafter, he was faced with the Covid pandemic. It was an extremely challenging time for us in the plant, as well as in Canada and the world. Jason was successful in having people return from being laid off to assist with the Covid pandemic by manufacturing medical masks.

During 2020 bargaining, Jason and the bargaining committee were successful in reopening the Oshawa Truck Plant and then in 2023, he helped bring back an historical contract. The entire committee and I would like to wish Jason well on his new well-deserved role. As a result of Jason's new role, he has appointed me for the balance of the term, as per our Local bylaws, until the election scheduled for early 2026.

On Friday, May 2, 2025, the company gave the Union six months' notice of the elimination of the third shift. The company has stated this decision is due to the United States of America imposing tariffs on Canadian-made vehicles. Considering that General Motors is one of the most powerful companies in North America, they are only appeasing Donald Trump. They are turning their backs on this membership.

We have reminded the company that Unifor's Oshawa membership is GM's most highly skilled, committed workforce in the corporation. Our membership continues to exceed all expectations for quality, productivity, and safety.

Eliminating a shift is unacceptable. The company needs to provide details around the expected timeline, impact to membership, product volume/ratio, and more. Meetings between the Union and Company will continue.

On Monday, May 5, 2025, we had an unexpected visit from the Premier of Ontario, Doug Ford. The Union was notified the morning of the 5th that his team made a request days before to visit the plant and it was approved. Once we found out, we immediately requested a meeting with the Premier. Myself, Districts, Brian Nicholls, Brian Troke, Scott Pearce, Jeff Wood; and President Jeff Gray were granted a ten-minute meeting. The ten-minute meeting, turned into a 45-minute meeting with Premier Ford, his Cabinet Ministers, and the Mayor of Oshawa, Dan Carter in attendance.

This was a closed-door meeting; the company was not present during the meeting. We made it clear to Premier Ford that this Union is not giving up on our membership and are going to fight the elimination of the third shift. We also told Premier Ford we expect he does not give up on the auto industry in this country and reminded him that this ship has not sailed.

We provided suggestions and examples how our plant can be more flexible and adaptable, highlighting our ability to build a wide range of products. The meeting was constructive, and they seemed to be listening to our suggestions.

In addition to the above, the company notified the Union of significant volume reductions for the months of May and June. This will result in rotational layoffs for all three shifts in June. For the month of June, the volume will be 400 trucks a day. The majority will be Heavy Duty content with some Light Duty pilot builds. The company is claiming this volume reduction is due to the build out of 2025 Light Duty. Production of the 2026 saleable Light Duties begins early August.

Week of June 2, Shift 3 is on layoff.

Week of June 9, Shift 1 is on layoff.

Week of June 16, Shift 2 is on layoff.

Week of June 23, Shift 2 is on layoff. Shift 2 will be paid SWW for the week of layoff (if eligible).

GM Members Reminded Not To Help Company Eliminate Our Jobs

AS THE COMPANY CONTINUES TO AGGRESSIVELY REDUCE jobs to satisfy the PIP plan it is more critical than ever that we guard against unsafe work practices.

With the rearrangement of jobs and elements, always adhere to your start and stop points of your footprint. Just because management insists these job changes are doable, it does not mean it can be done in a safe manner.

If you have a safety or ergo concern, notify your group leader. If they cannot resolve the concern to your satisfaction, then it must be added to the ESCP.

If you believe your job does not have enough time and cannot be completed safely using the standardized work outlined in your bluebook, then the company and the union have a job concern tracking process in place to document and address these issues.

The onset of warmer weather brings high temperatures inside our buildings.

Our annual heat stress program has commenced earlier this year as of May 15. Water will be distributed throughout the plant when the building temperature reach pre-determined humidity thresholds.

The Joint Health and Safety Committee decides where to put a wet-bulb thermometer in each building. This thermometer measures the temperature and humidity in that area and the JHSC has chosen the hottest area. Once the outside humidex has reached 30 degrees the JHSC and your committee people monitor the readings.

mary. I want to be clear: that cost is not on us. It's on management.

Non-conformance usually happens when tools don't work properly, instructions aren't clear, people don't get the right training, or the work is rushed without a proper plan. Those aren't mistakes made by the people doing the job-they're the result of decisions made by management, who determine the processes and procedures we're expected to follow.

As workers, we're showing up every day, doing our best, and often going above and beyond just to keep things running. We fix problems we didn't cause, we ask questions when something doesn't make sense, and we step in to help each other. That's not the sign of a team cutting corners-that's the sign of a team doing its best with what we're given.

If the company really wants to cut down on costs, they should start by looking at where the problems are coming from-not by pointing fingers at the shop floor. We can't fix what

we're not included in. We need better tools, better communication, and respect for the work we do.

And let's not forget-bargaining is coming. That means it's our chance to speak up for what we deserve. We've kept things running, we've dealt with the pressure, and we've handled it all with professionalism and pride. Now it's time for the company to recognize that.

We need to be paid fairly for the work we do. That includes proper wages, better working conditions, and the respect we've more than earned. The company finds money when it needs to-now they need to find it for the people doing the real work.

THERE ARE MANY GM RETIREES AND THEIR FAMILIES WHO are prepared with their "final arrangements."

However... there are many who are not, based on the calls received by the Union Hall when our GM members die.

The Union wants our members and their families to be as prepared as possible while they're under no stress.

Here's a checklist:

confirm address that GM has on record

All pensions are processed through the GM Canada Benefits Centre. It's important to keep all information up-to-date with the GM Canada Benefits office.

☐ confirm current spouse/beneficiary

□ confirm the surviving spouse pension payment amount, if applicable

□ confirm the life insurance amount. Remember it decreases with age.

The GM Benefits Centre's online portal is a useful tool for getting your information: www.gmcanadabenefits.com

If you haven't been online, update your security questions by calling 1-877-442-4625. Have your SIN and birthdate ready to punch into the phone system to speak with a representative.

☐ Secure (not secret) place for SIN card and birth certificate

"My spouse did everything"

- ☐ Share the load. Make sure your spouse and/or a trusted family member has the information detailed in this article.
- ☐ Passwords. It's a new world. If your family wants to shut down your email, Facebook account, or switch the utility bills to the surviving spouse's name, they need your passwords.

"It's all paperwork & grief"

The service reps at the Union Hall can help. We need a copy of the death certificate, plus the name and phone number of the person reporting the death. This information can be emailed to local222@local222.ca or faxed to the Union Hall at 905-436-9515.

All the relevant paperwork from GM Canada Benefits Centre, Green Shield and Sun Life comes to the address on file by Canada Post. These take about 15 business days.

"What's dad's number?"

Everybody needs a current will. Unifor Legal Services (905-433-4242/1-800-387-6592) prepares wills. Legal Services will ask for the member's GM badge number or GMIN. The Union Hall staff can provide the number if needed.

If the residence with the address on file with the GM Canada Benefits Centre is being sold, we strongly recommend the Executor put at least one year's forward with Canada Post to make sure all appropriate tax slips are received for the estate filing.

- ☐ Original will: Where it's kept
- ☐ Marriage certificate, birth certificate of spouse and of any dependent children.
- ☐ List of the deceased's financial institutions. These ask for a copy of the will and an original death certificate when the estate trustee is ready to close the accounts.
- ☐ Location of safety deposit box.
- ☐ Certificates for all investments held by the deceased.
- ☐ Life insurance policies, other than the one with Sun Life from GM.
- □ Details of debts, including names, address and account numbers of all creditors (i.e. mortgages, loans, credit cards, landlords, nursing homes, hospitals).
- Real estate titles
- Vehicle owners slip

The following need to be dealt with:

- ☐ insurances (house, cottage, trailer, car, renter)
- ☐ cancel any government benefit payments
- ☐ cancel drivers licence/transfer vehicle ownership
- ☐ cancel miscellaneous automatic banking withdrawals: i.e. magazine subscriptions, club memberships
- □ check for credit card insurance with credit card company; cancel cards

"There's a Union death benefit"

There is no death benefit through the union. This common myth is likely from a time when the Local would help process the federal CPP death benefit. The majority of funeral homes/crematoriums assist with this now.



Time to End Ontario's Hospital Crisis

WITH THE RECENT ONTARIO AND FEDERAL ELECTIONS behind us we now wait to see what path the provincial and federal governments will take.

Will a Mark Carney government be successful in fighting tariffs imposed by Donald Trump and in doing so will he be responsive to the needs of the auto sector in Canada. Will he eliminate interprovincial trade barriers and build a more self-sufficient economy?

In Ontario, will Doug Ford tackle the long-term care crisis his government is responsible for or now that the election is over will he continue to make his corporate friends, especially those in the health care sector, richer than they already are at the expense of working people?

A recent report by the Canadian Centre for Policy Alternatives, illustrates the rise of private health staffing agencies and the costs associated with them have come at the expense of our Ontario public hospitals.

The report shows that Ontario has the lowest per capita hospital spending in the country. Ontario hospital spending increased by 4 percent from 2011 to 2022. Most of the increase came in 2022 when the province received federal pandemic funds to combat Covid-19. The result of this is that the funding increases did not keep up with inflation and population growth.

The result of this inadequate funding is that 49 percent of Ontario hospitals had budget deficits in 2023-24.

Rather that simply funding hospital deficits to prevent staffing vacancies, Ontario hospitals have had to resort to private for-profit staffing agencies to maintain services and prevent closures. Because of this Ontario hospitals have paid for-profit agencies \$9.2 billion over the past 10 years.

The main reason for the \$9.2 billion expenditure is that private for-profit agency staff can be three times more expensive than regular employees.

Ontario has become one of the most undercapacity hospital systems in the industrialized world because of the underfunding and staffing crisis. Ontario ranked 33 out of 38 Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD), and in Canada, Ontario had the second fewest staffed hospital beds per capita in 2022-23.

During the next four years rather than carry on with the privatization of our health care system and making his millionaire and billionaire friends wealthier, Ford should put an end to understaffing and the hollowing out of public hospitals by using our tax dollars to adequately fund our private hospitals and put an end to funding private for-profit agencies.
